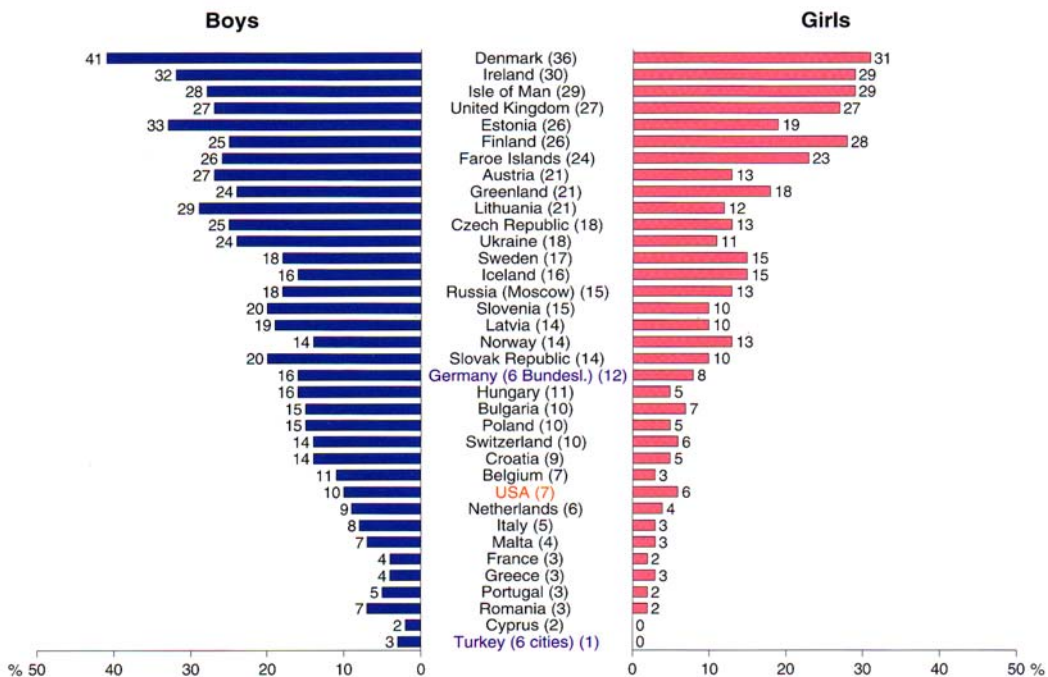
International Comparisons

International health surveys show the UK as having unusually high levels of 'risk' behaviour in teenagers, particularly in relation to alcohol, illegal drugs and sexual activity.

Values within brackets refer to all students. Data sorted by all students. Germany and Turkey: limited geographical coverage. USA: limited comparability

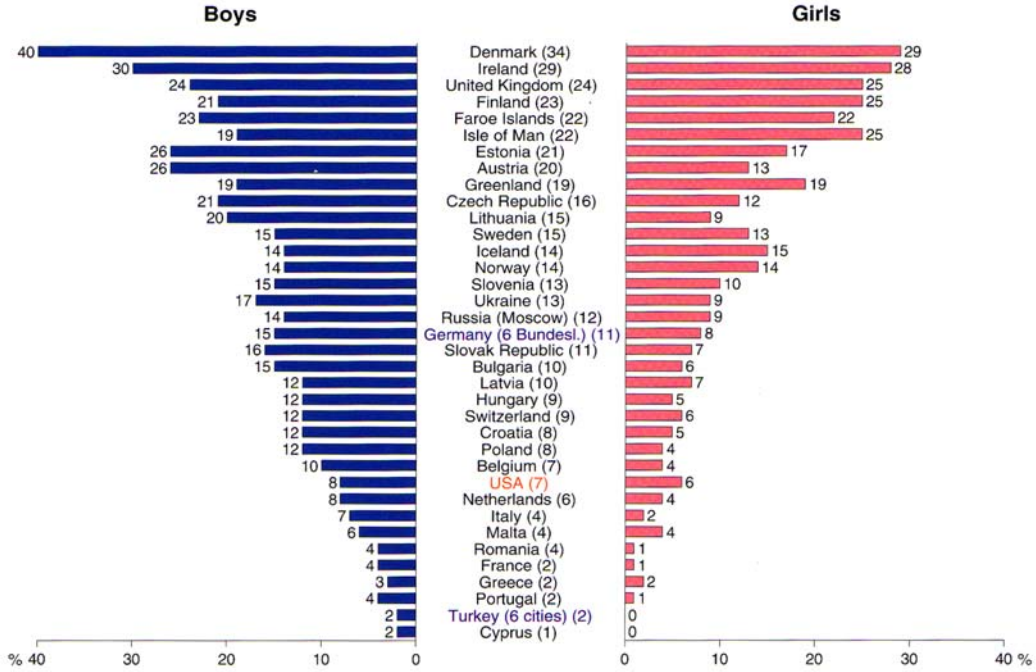

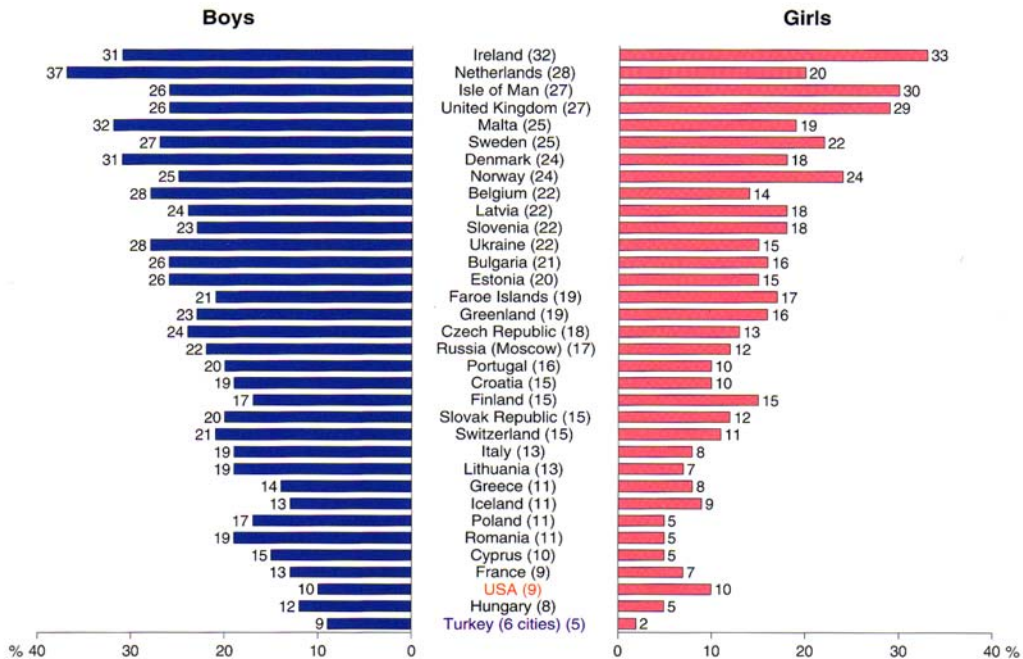

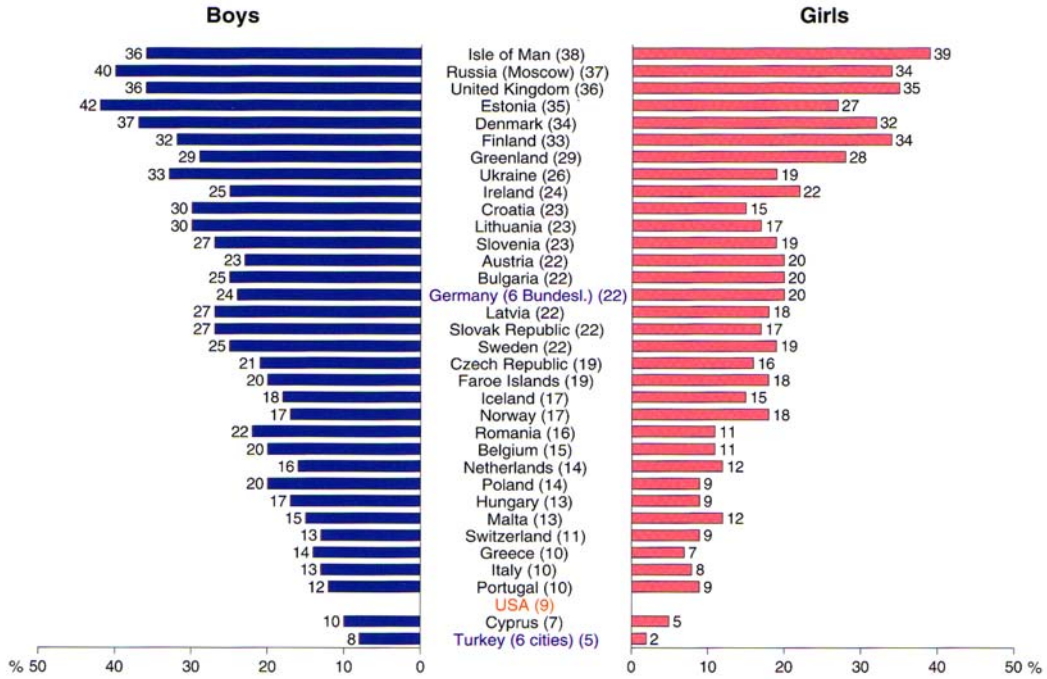

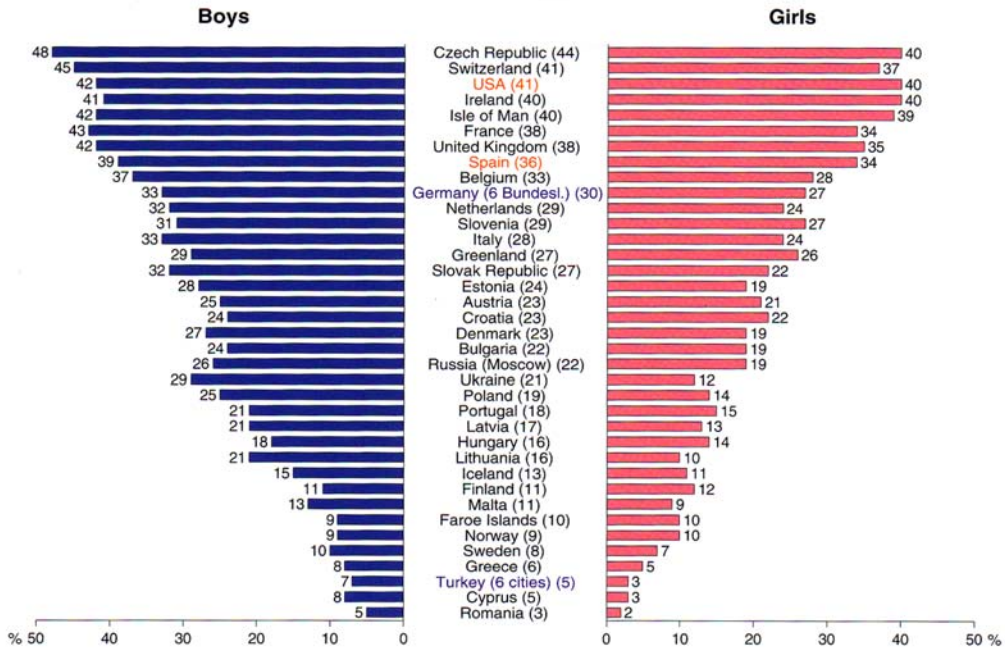

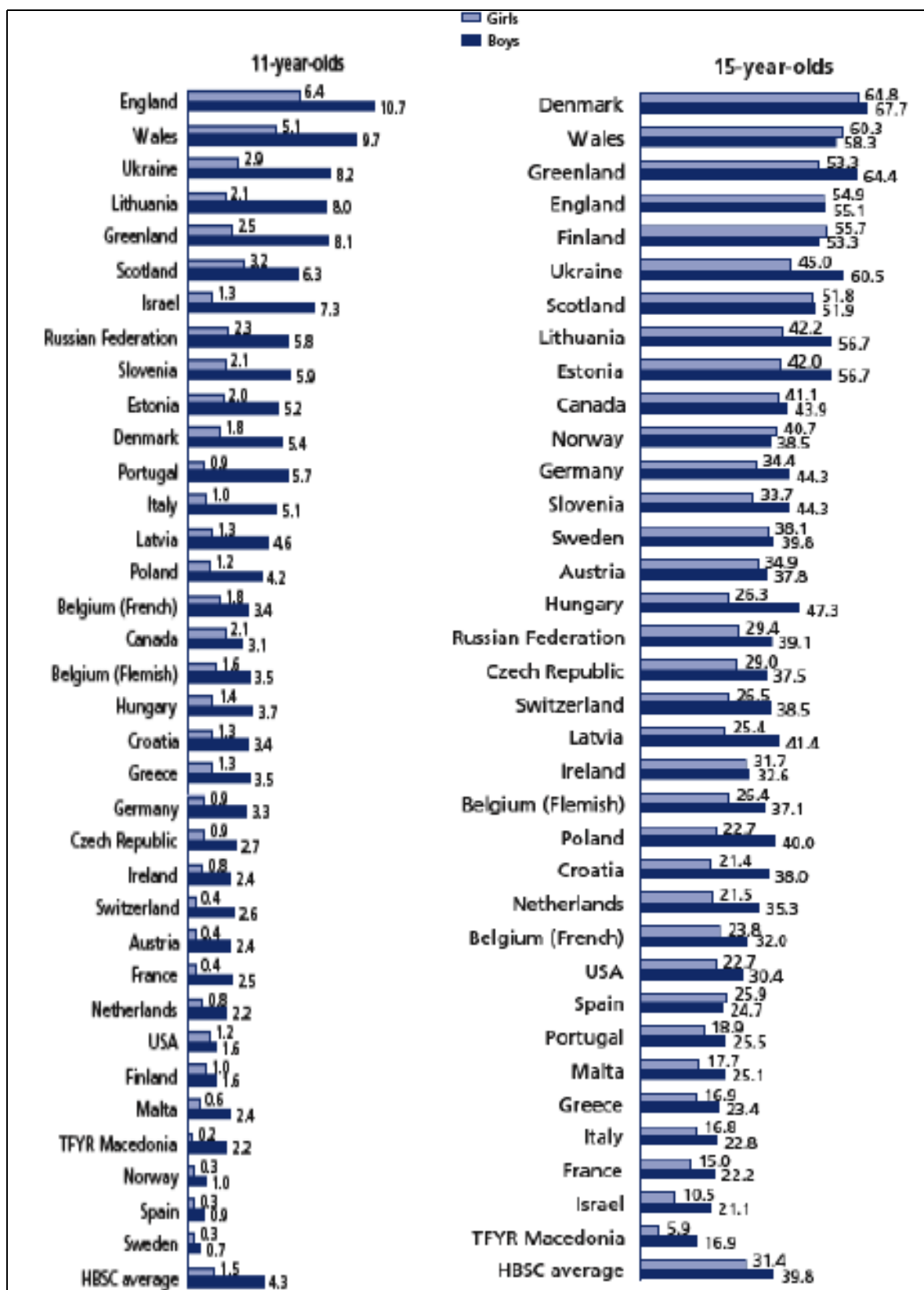
Lifetime experience of any illicit drug. Percentages among boys and girls¹

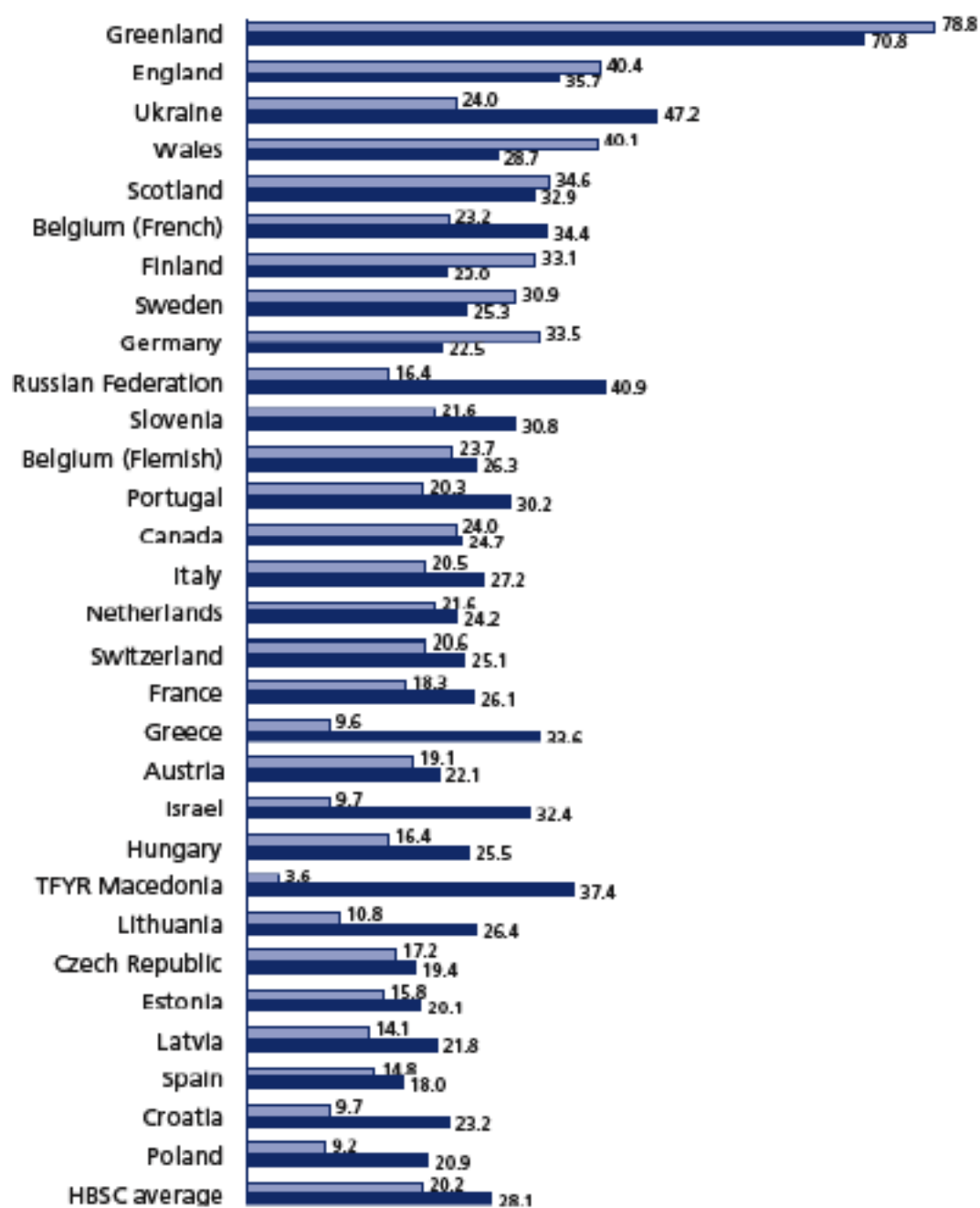

Young people who have been drunk two or more times (%)²



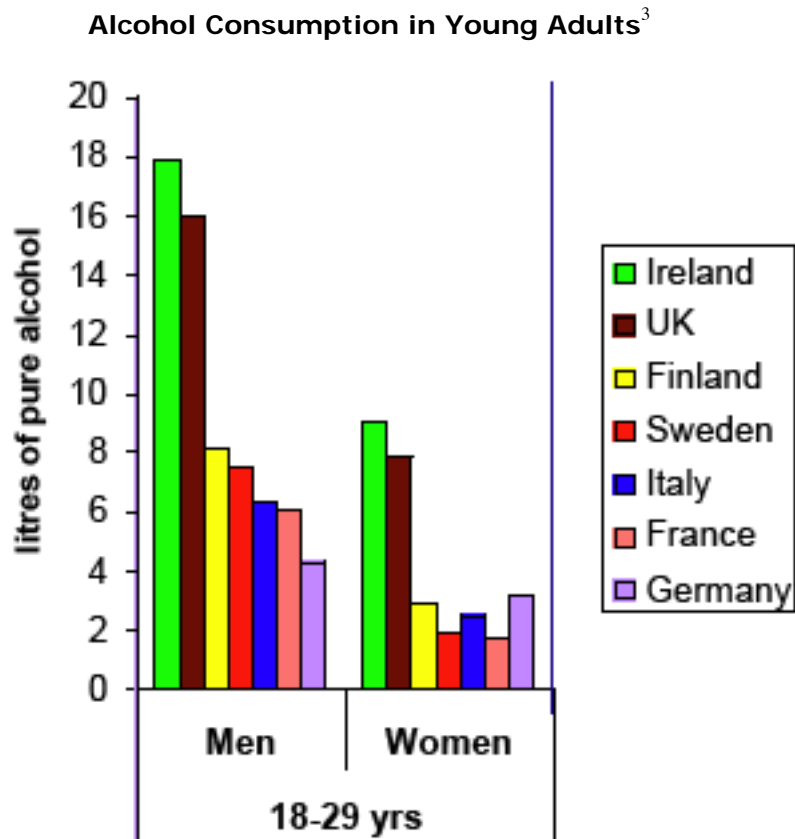
Young people who have had sexual intercourse, 15 year olds²
